



Connecticut ranked 39<sup>th</sup> in Regular Army (RA) soldier transitions. <1.0% (282) of the RA population for FY23 transitioned to Connecticut.

## **CT FY23 RA Transitions**

- > 59,535 (left the Army)
- > 30 (Joined in CT)
- > 12 (returned to CT; about 60% loss)
- **270** (outsiders moved to CT)
- **282** to CT






<sup>\*</sup>MSA stands for Metropolitan Statistical Area. A MSA is a predetermined land area that contains a population center with at least 50,000 people residing within its borders (Census Bureau). Some of the MSAs split states but the numbers only reflect the CT side of the MSA. **ALL** data represents **ONLY** those with Honorable/general service.








Demographics of the 282 RA soldiers that transitioned to Connecticut in FY23.
