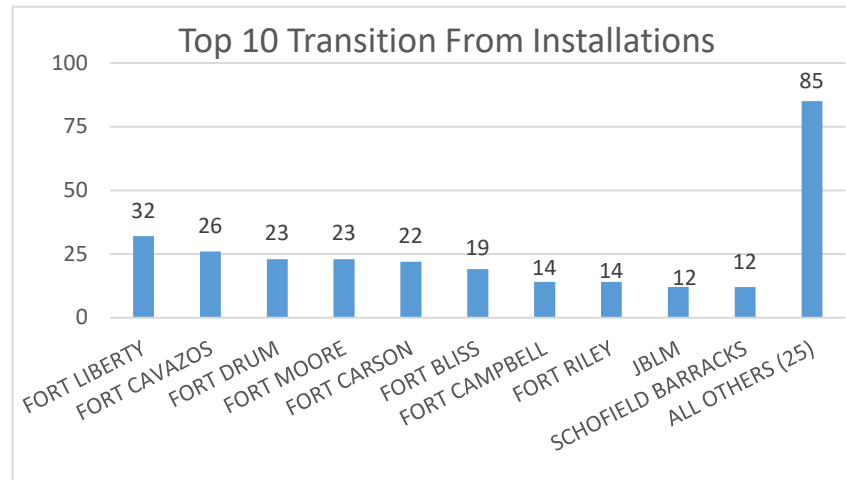
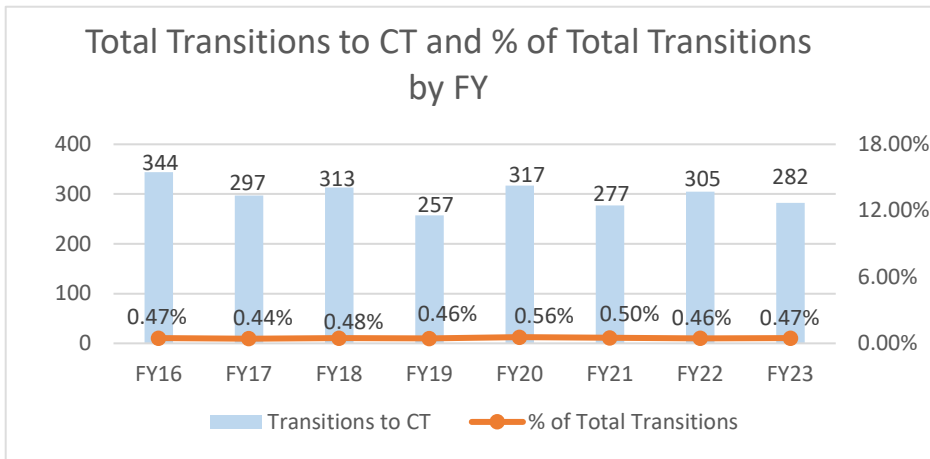

- ❖ **282 to CT**



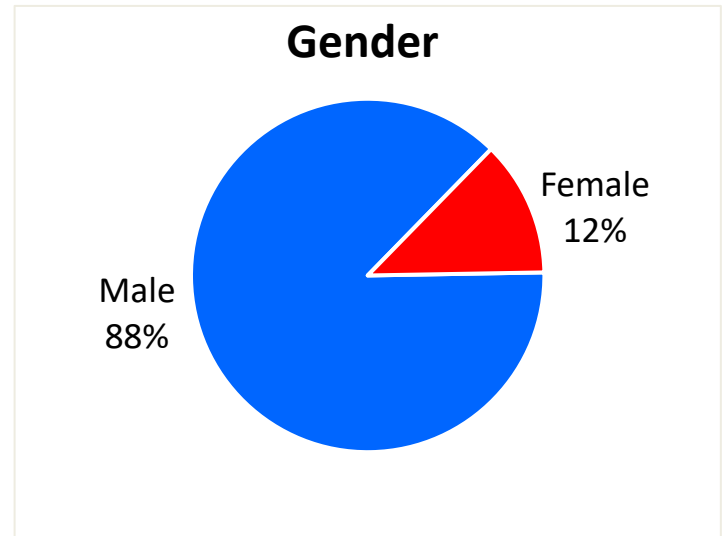
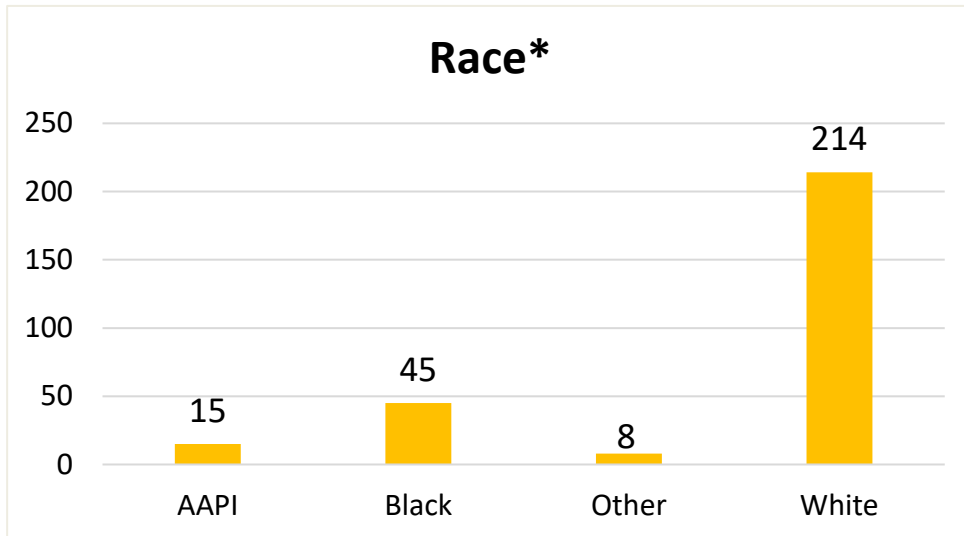
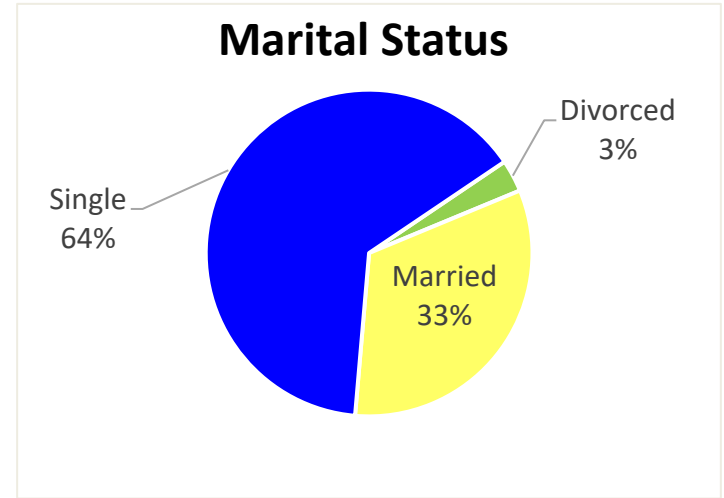
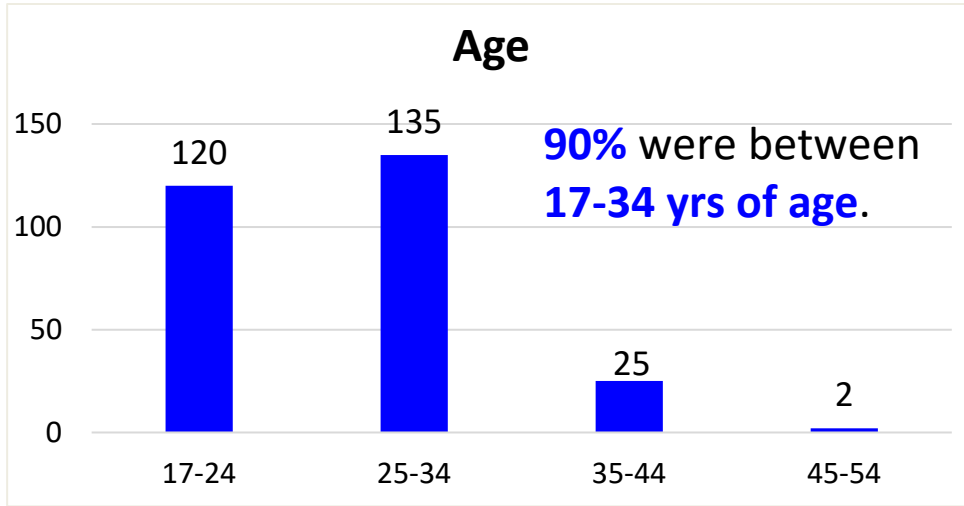

\*Note: AI/AN= American Indian/Alaska Native; AAPI= Asian American Pacific Islander; Other= blank, other and unknown

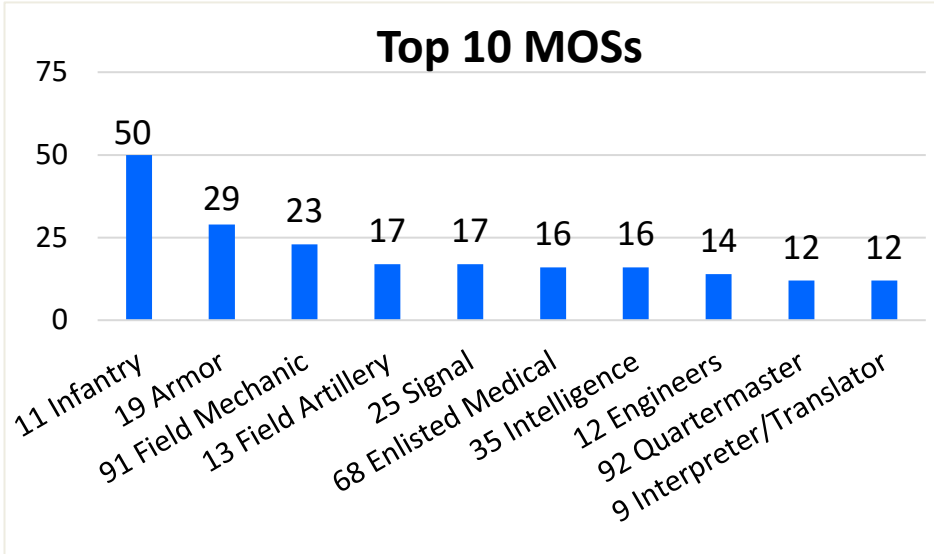

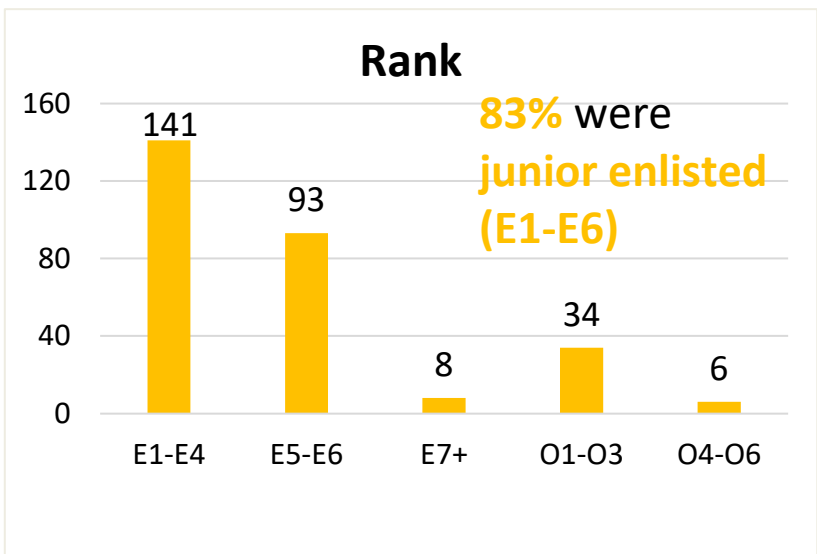


Demographics of RA Soldiers that transitioned to Connecticut in FY23.

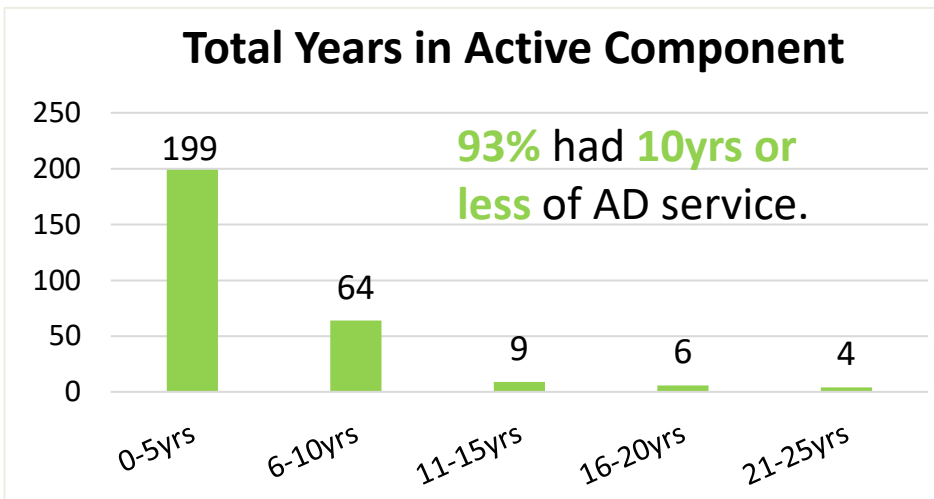
