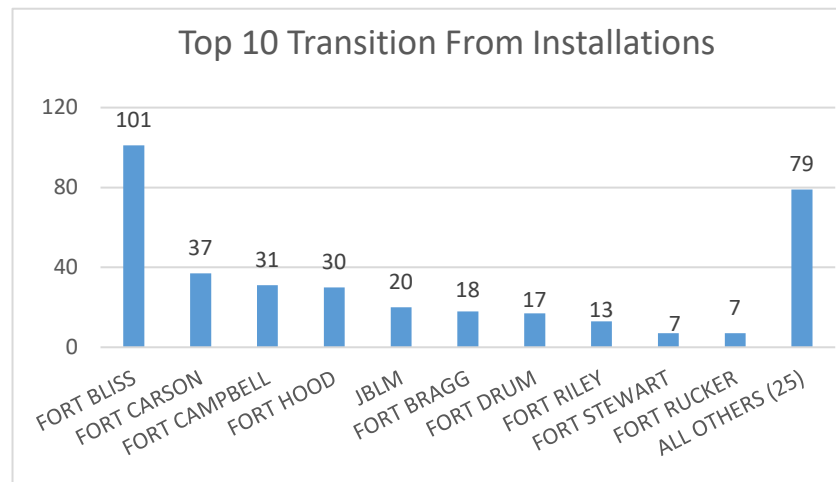
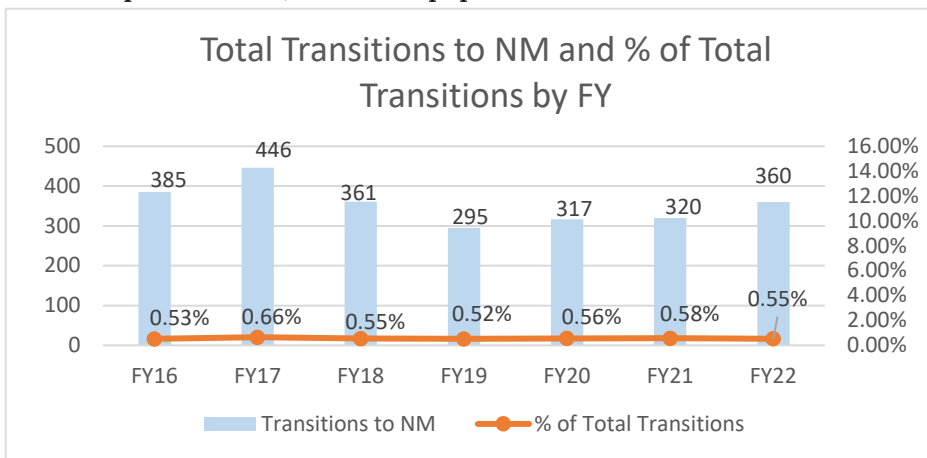


New Mexico ranked 35th in Regular Army (RA) soldier transitions. 1.0% (360) of the RA population for FY22 transitioned to New Mexico.

\*MS MSA stands for Metropolitan Statistical Area. A MSA is a predetermined land area that contains a population center with at least 50,000 people residing within its borders. A Micropolitan Area has a population center of at least 10,000 but less than 50,000 (Census Bureau).

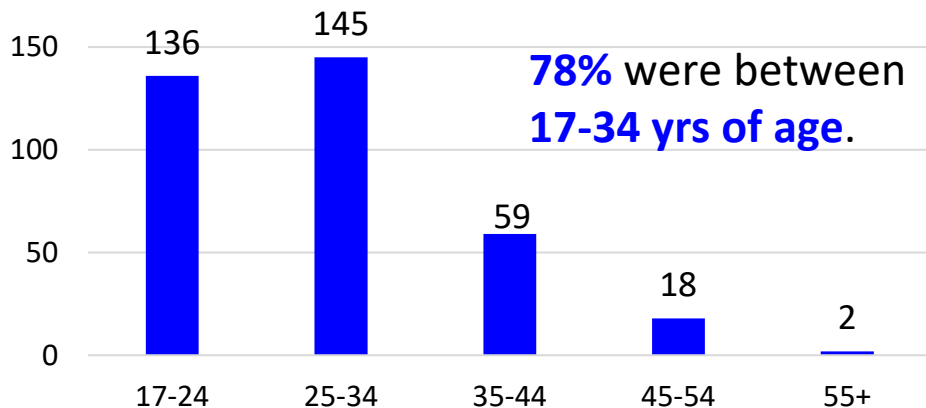

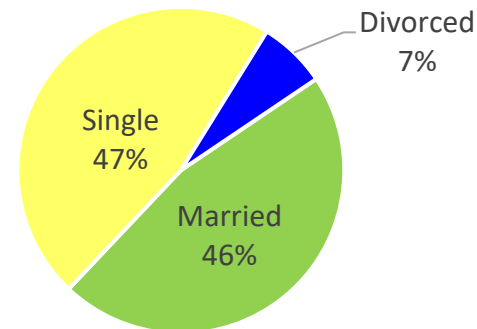


Demographics of the 360 RA soldiers that transitioned to New Mexico in FY22.

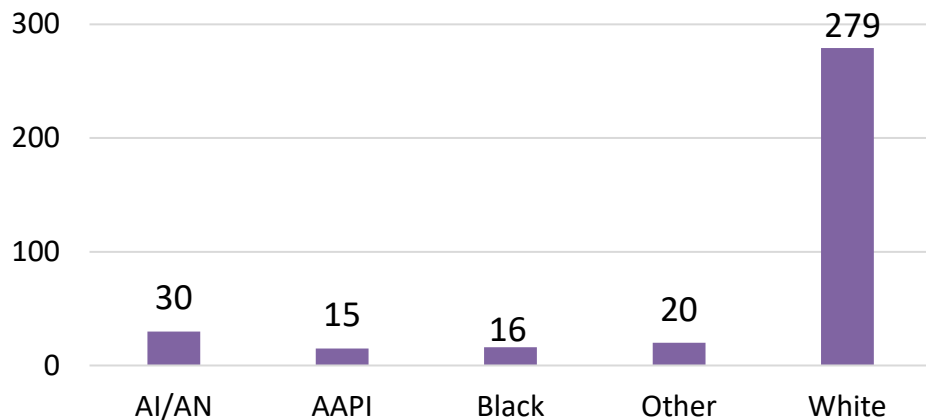
## Age



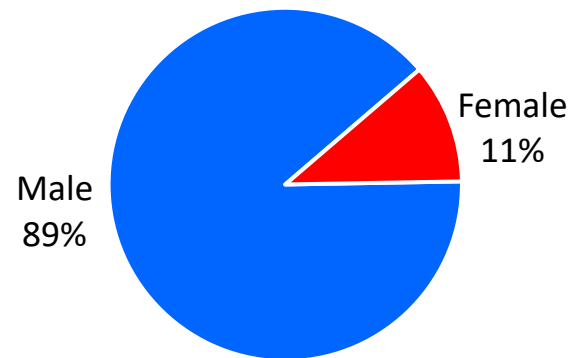
## Marital Status
