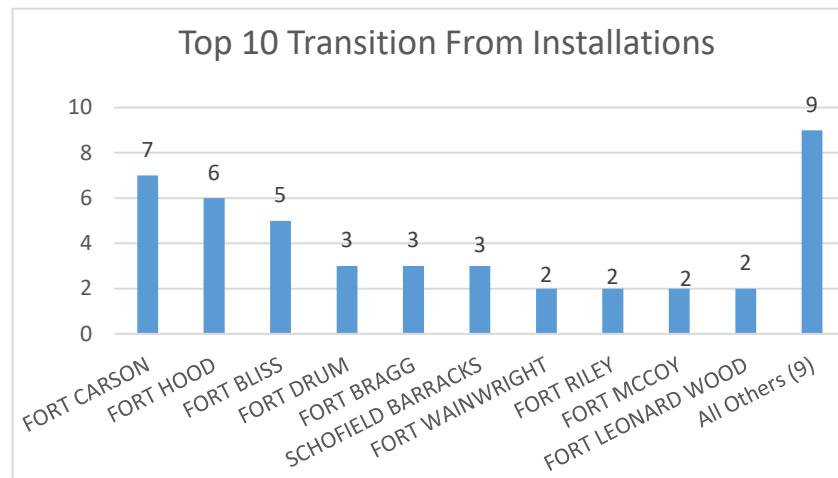
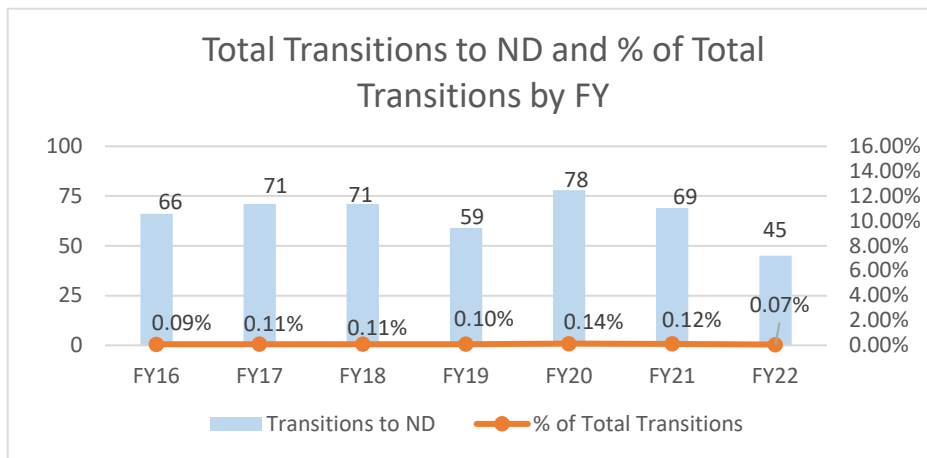

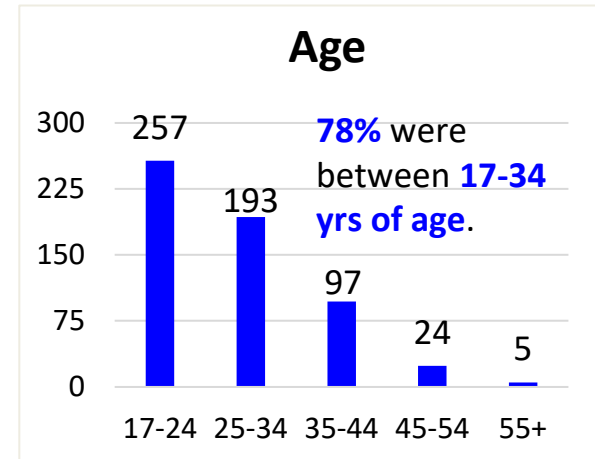

 *MSA stands for Metropolitan Statistical Area. A MSA is a predetermined land area that contains a population center with at least 50,000 people residing within its borders (Census Bureau). Some of the MSAs split states but the numbers only reflect the ND side of the MSA. Some MSAs split states however the numbers only reflect those that transitioned to the ND side of the MSA.

*Note: AAPI= Asian Pacific Islander AI/AN= American Indian/ Alaska Native

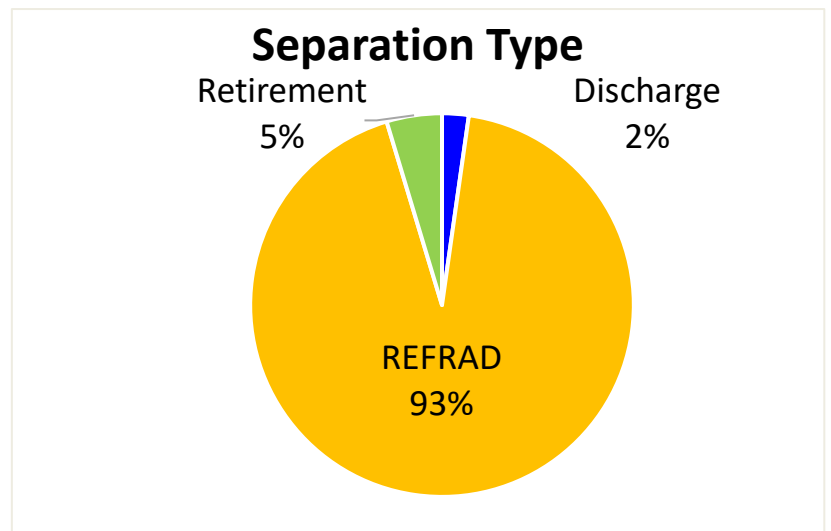
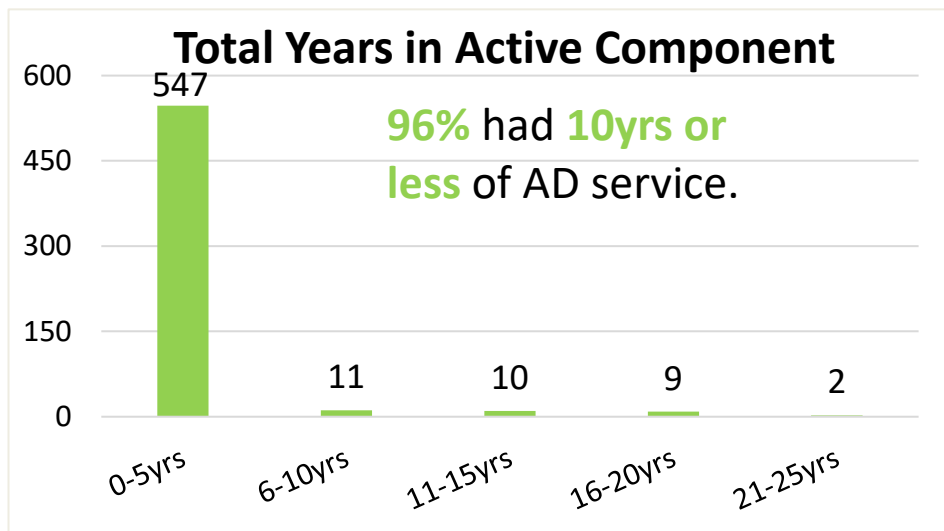
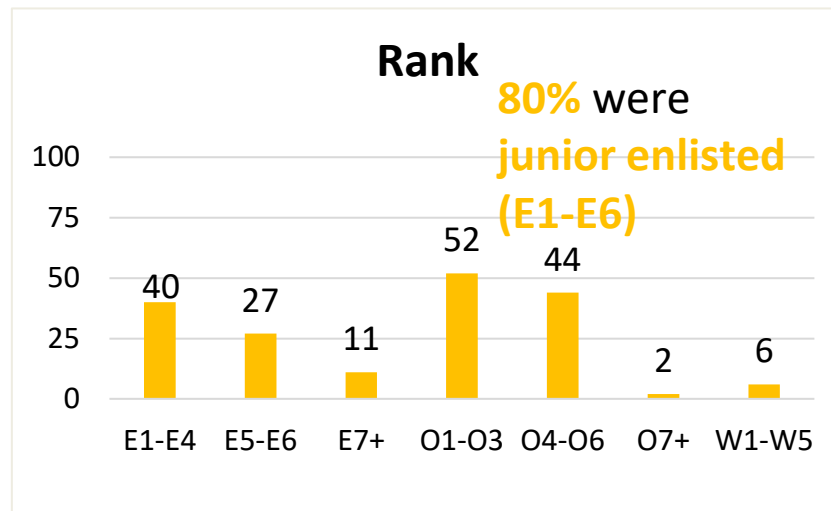
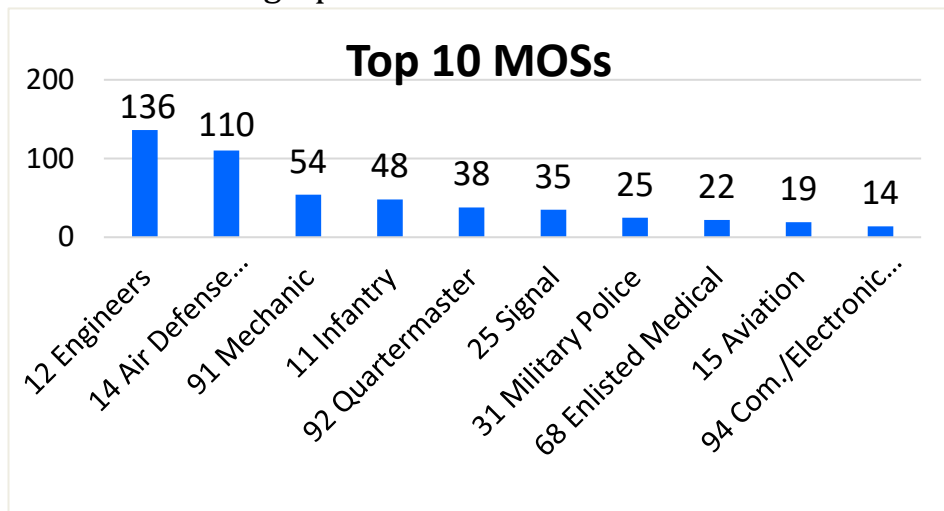
