





^{*} MSA stands for Metropolitan Statistical Area. A MSA is a predetermined land area that contains a population center with at least 50,000 people residing within its borders. A Micropolitan Area has a population center of at least 10,000 but less than 50,000 (Census Bureau). Some MSAs split states however the numbers only reflect those that transitioned to the RI side of the MSA.










Demographics of the 264 soldiers that transitioned to Rhode Island in FY22.




Demographics of Soldiers that transitioned to Rhode Island in FY22
