





<sup>\*</sup> MSA stands for Metropolitan Statistical Area. A MSA is a predetermined land area that contains a population center with at least 50,000 people residing within its borders. A Micropolitan Area has a population center of at least 10,000 but less than 50,000 (Census Bureau).










Demographics of the 723 soldiers that transitioned to Vermont in FY22.




Demographics of Soldiers that transitioned to Vermont in FY22
