
¹North Dakota ranked 51st in Regular Army (RA) soldier transitions. <1% (54) of the RA population for FY23 transitioned to North Dakota.




¹ Due to the small population of transitioned RA Soldiers to the state, all three Components are examined in all data points for this presentation unless otherwise specified. *MSA stands for Metropolitan Statistical Area. A MSA is a predetermined land area that contains a population center with at least 50,000 people residing within its borders (Census Bureau). N/A Rural is describes an area that is considered a Micropolitan Area, or less in population. Some of the MSAs split states but the numbers only reflect ND. **ALL** numbers are those with Honorable/general service.










Demographics of the 585 soldiers that transitioned to North Dakota in FY23.
