
Introduction

SOLDIER FOR LIFE

Every year, roughly 62,000 Soldiers transition out of the Army*. To better serve this population, the Soldier for Life Analytics and Research team conducts a thorough investigation on the demographics of those that transitioned back into the civilian population, state by state. While we cannot know with exact certainty the number of Soldiers in our sampling that relocated to, or remained in, these areas, this is currently the best tool we have to speculate about the population and location for post service residency. In addition to assessing where Soldiers planned on residing after service, we simultaneously evaluated where they entered from. Each state overview is broken down by how many Soldiers entered service from that state, how many stated an intent to return/stay in that state, and how many non-state natives planned on making that state their home. The data are further

broken down by those individuals who transitioned from an installation within the state and those who transitioned from another state. Demographics are also provided on the bottom of each page for all Soldiers who planned on going to or staying in the state. All data presented in the following analysis is derived strictly from transitioned Soldiers' DD-214s, which is populated from the Army's TRANSPROC system. Data pulled spans the 2022 fiscal year (FY22).

It is important to note that this review may not include all states if there is a low sample size and less than 100 soldiers that transitioned to that state.


